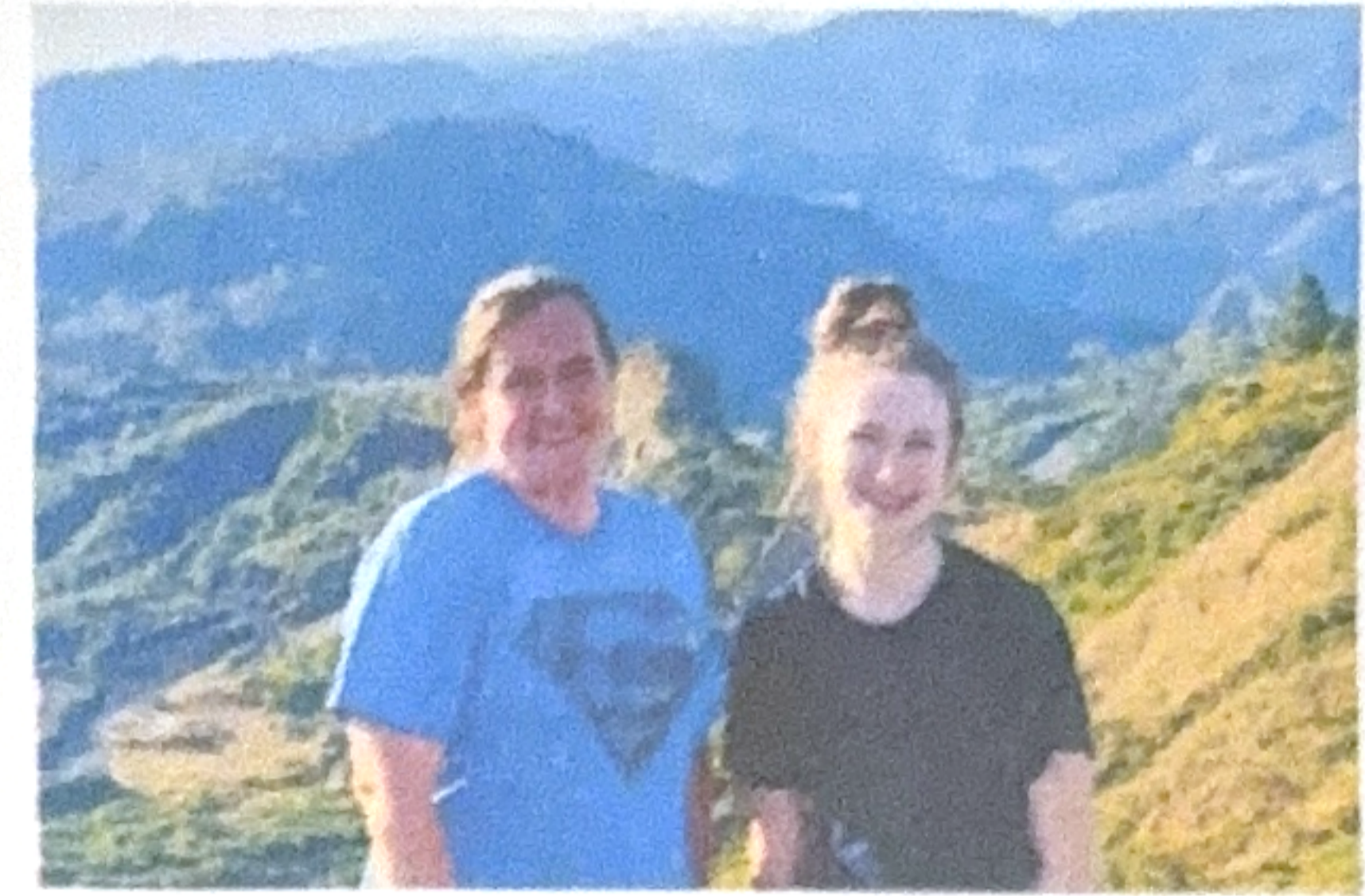

Dear Friends,

My 2026 started off with a friend coming to visit! It's the first time in a long time that someone besides my dad has come to visit me in Honduras for a missions trip. It was a young lady from my home church. I'm so glad she had the opportunity to come visit. It was nice to have someone from home come visit to show them my "world"!



In January, I was informed that when my house contract ended in March, the owners would not be renewing it. That gave me about six weeks to find a new place to rent. Unfortunately, finding housing here can be very difficult. First, there are very few places that actually advertise when they are renting. Many people do not want others to know a house is empty for fear of theft or squatters. Because of that, most rentals are found through word of mouth. A friend and I spent many hours driving around and asking people if they knew of any houses available to rent. Once we found a possibility, we also had to make sure it was in a safe area and that it had basic things like plumbing and electricity. Needless to say, it was quite a process! But as always, the Lord provided. I was able to find a place, and I am very thankful. The contract is only for one year, so please pray with me as I consider what to do about my housing situation in the future.



One unexpected blessing during this stressful situation was that my dad was able to come to help me with the move. I always love when my family has the opportunity to visit. He was a huge help during the week he was here. We filled holes and painted at the old house, installed my washer and dryer, hung curtain rods, built shelves, rewired a few things, and completed many other small projects around the new house. He even made biscuits and gravy for me one morning! His visit was such a blessing.

While he was here, we were invited to eat supper at the New Life Boys Academy. This is a ministry that I personally support, so I was excited to show it to my dad. Marcos Lara, who leads the ministry, grew up in a children's home. After he trusted Christ as his Savior at the age of 17, he later attended our seminary where he met his wife, Alfryd. Today they faithfully serve the Lord together by caring for boys in their home and training them to become men who love and follow God. Currently they have 18 boys living in the home. Their budget is very limited (\$20 per child each month), but they are doing an amazing work investing in the lives of these young men.
