Dear Friends,

Did you know that scorpions glow a neon blue-green color under UV light? Or that female scorpions can give birth to anywhere from 20 to 100 babies at a time? Or that a frozen scorpion can thaw out, wake up, and walk away as if nothing happened! Since moving into my new house at the beginning of March, I have learned quite a bit about scorpions. Why? Because my new house seems to be infested with them. As of today, I have found—and killed—31 scorpions. In fact, over the past three months, I have seen more scorpions than I did during my previous 10½ years in Honduras combined. I had the house fumigated, which seems to have helped, but they keep showing up. At this point, I just grab a shoe and whack ‘em without wasting time panicking. It's become just another part of daily life!



I have also been greatly encouraged by the growth of my bus route over the past two months. Recently, a family moved back into the area whose children used to ride with me to church several years ago before they moved away.



After returning, one of the first things they did was contact me because their children wanted to come back to church! Not only did they return, but they also invited several friends and neighbors to come along. Recently, I have been averaging 15–18 children on Sundays and 10–15 for our midweek service. It has been exciting to see the Lord continue to grow this ministry. In April, I held a special promotion for the route and took everyone with perfect attendance for the month to the city for lunch. It was a wonderful opportunity to reward their faithfulness and spend extra time with them outside of our regular services. Please pray that these children and teens will continue to grow in their relationship with the Lord!



Another highlight from the past few months was the completion of our seminary school year. This year, three young ladies graduated from the program. One graduate is returning to her home church to assist her pastor and pastor’s wife in the ministry there. The other two graduates will soon be leaving for Africa, where they will spend three months helping a missionary family. One of the greatest joys of ministry is seeing people whom God has allowed us to teach and disciple step out to serve Him. While graduation marks the end of a season of training, it is really the beginning of a new season of ministry. We are thankful for what the Lord has done in their lives and look forward to seeing how He continues to use them in the years ahead.
